Drive towards terrorism

Ideologies and beliefs motivates terrorists

Reports and studies have showed that there are various ideologies and beliefs that have been the sources of motivation for terrorism. When such motivators have been instilled in a person after they are recruited by terrorisms and militia groups in the quest to achieve political and economic goals, the core for suicidal decisions is formed perfectly. According to Haynes (2009), the criminal conduct that can be seen in many criminal does not necessarily describe who they are. Instead, they are a manifestation of a common believe where the urge to conduct terror activities clouds the personal judgment. The traditional rationality that is generally the mentality and philosophy of the party is deeply instilled in a recruiting by demands to fit in and claim violent acts. In an individual, the pressure to comply and behave aggressively is influenced by social pressure, whilst the collective unit retains the terrorist in the group. After successfully being in a group, a terrorist conforms and behaves aggressively on the basis of the beliefs and values of groups

Types of ideologies motivating terrorists

Many ideas have been found to be the key motivations behind many militia groups such as the al Qaeda. For example, political radicalism and intense beliefs in region are key factors that motivate many criminals to engage in criminal activities. The political beliefs are related to the urge for the control as well as political gains which could be either power, harming political parties and leaders, and destabilizing the government for gains as well. Haynes assert that many political problems have instigated many terror activities. To propagate ideologies such as socialism and communism, many terror group use the terror activities which leads to loss of lives.

Today, religion has become a facilitator or motivator for strong beliefs that compel the criminals to conduct their terrorism activities. Many terrorists who conduct their terror activities with religious propositions, they often seek freedom, recognition, respect, and domination. However, Haynes argue that there could be terrorist who conduct they activities in the name of religion affiliation and supremacy while there could be other motivates motivating them. Some seek funds to finance their terror activities. The hidden motives could be centered on economic, social influence, and political supremacies. Islamism is one of the religion whose members have been involved in many religion-based education.
